Dear Friends,

You may have seen or heard of the recent Com Res opinion poll on Easter and forgiveness. The poll – of just over 2000 adults – claims to show what the whole nation believes. What, then, do we make of the fact that only half (48%) of those who call themselves Christian believe that Jesus died and rose again so that they could be forgiven for their sins?

Well, the related survey question was quite long and contained a number of different ideas, each one of which could have caused different people difficulty in answering. For example, I know some people (and conceivably some who would call themselves Christians) stumble at the very idea that Jesus existed as a person in history. Now obviously, if you genuinely believe the whole Jesus story is a legend, then it stands to reason that you'll struggle to give a sensible answer to a question which seems to suggest it's historical. But let's think about this for a moment. Evidence for Jesus' existence is accepted as sound by all serious historians of the period. It is surely a matter of national embarrassment that our education system has allowed students to conclude that Jesus was no more real than Winnie the Pooh. If you're interested in investigating this, you might like to read "The Christ Files" by John Dickson – or we could watch his short DVD together and discuss what we learn.

Other people may well have been happy to assert that Jesus died (i.e. as a real person in history), but were then put off by the suggestion that he rose again from the dead. There are plenty of people who claim to be Christian who say they value Jesus' teaching and seek to live in line with it, but who find the idea of his resurrection difficult to believe. Again, I'd want to suggest such people actually examine the evidence and follow it where it leads. You can read books written by people who have done just this. I'd commend "Who moved the stone?" by Frank Morison, or "The Case for Christ" by Lee Strobel. Both men set out intending to undermine the Christian faith. Both men came to believe it.

Then of course, it's likely that other people will have been challenged by the idea that Jesus' death and resurrection are instrumental in our forgiveness. There are different levels to this challenge, too, e.g. some might think only his death is connected with the forgiveness of sins (i.e. his resurrection isn't). I actually heard a Church of England Priest on the radio say that the idea of Jesus dying for forgiveness "just doesn't make sense". His statement went as an unchallenged assertion (of course). Personally, I'd be very interested to watch him discuss this with Jesus, who said he came "to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mark 10:45) and later instructed his disciples to eat bread and drink wine to remember him, saying of the wine, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many *for the forgiveness of sins*," (Matt 26:28, my emphasis). What would this priest say to the Apostle Paul, who taught about reconciliation and forgiveness: "God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things ... by making peace through [Jesus'] blood, shed on the cross," (Col 1:20)? Or "God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them," (2 Cor 5:19)? And of course if sin is not actually dealt with by Jesus' death and resurrection, then how does God forgive us? Answers on a postcard...

May you know God's forgiveness and the new life he gives in Jesus,

News from the Parish Council

Following the recent election we now have a new council. There have been two changes from the old one. Gas Sheraidah decided not to stand this time around. Gas has been on the Council for many years and has served the community with dedication and enthusiasm for which we are all extremely grateful. Jane Moseley has joined as a new councillor and we are very grateful to her for stepping up to the plate. We are all looking forward to working with her on the projects for the year ahead.

The Wareside clean up took place over the weekend of 16 and 17 March this year. More than a dozen parishioners turned up over the course of the weekend to take part. Major items found included a 4ft propane gas cylinder which was picked up by BOC, and a medium sized fire extinguisher. Altogether a total of about 55 bags of rubbish were collected which was a significant achievement. We are very grateful to everyone who took part.

On the subject of litter, the Council will be organising a clean up of Little Oak Heath, the land at the back of Kingham Road on 1 June starting at 10am. Please do come along if you can. Work on re-wilding parts of that land is continuing. Trees are being planted and benches are being installed. We also have plans to improve access to the land so that everyone can enjoy it.

Plans for the major new development North of Ware are continuing to evolve and the Master planning process has started. The master plan will guide and control future planning applications for the site so is potentially very important. The process will involve a series of meetings over the course of the next few months between the District Council, the site promoters and other stakeholders to finalise the masterplan. The Parish Council will be represented at all of the meetings to ensure that Wareside's views are put forward and, hopefully taken into account. Watch out also for any public meetings about the development organised by the Promoters which will be an opportunity for you to express your views personally. The first of these took place over the weekend of 17/18 May and again the Council was represented.
