

The index to the Society's new book refers to no fewer than eleven castles. All are shadows of their former selves, but many can still be seen and just a few may be visited.





A fine example of what a typical Norman castle may have been like exists at **Stansted Mountfitchet**. Although little survives other than the mound on which the original castle once stood, a wooden stockade and village have been recreated. The mottes are still visible from Norman castles at **Anstey**, **Great Canfield** and **Stebbing**.

The parish of **Castle Camps** takes its name from the castle which dated back to Saxon times. **Clavering** castle's buildings were surrounded by a large ditch which can still be seen, adjacent to the churchyard.

Civil war raged in England between Stephen and his cousin Matilda from 1135 to 1153, a time known as The Anarchy which saw considerable castle building. Geoffrey de Mandeville, the Earl of Essex, swapped sides more than once. He built the castle at **Saffron Walden**. Some ruined walls still remain and they are Grade I listed, the finest surviving stone castle within the Hundred Parishes. De Mandeville also built the castle at **Pleshey** during the Anarchy. The large motte still remains. The present village of Pleshey lies mostly inside the outer bailey earthwork which is clearly visible along much of its length.

As goldfish went, Bob was a bit excitable. Unlike Finn, he wasn't satisfied with the castle and its tall thin tree. It had all been interesting enough when he was first plopped out of the plastic bag into Finn's tank. In those early days, Finn himself had been an endless source of amusement — either chasing him or allowing himself to be chased up and down, round and round. But not anymore. Finn was old and slow and annoyingly content simply to wait patiently for the one moment of excitement each day when the food plopped down from above. The appearances of the human faces were growing less frequent, and now it was Bob's turn to press his face against the tank sides trying to get a clear view of the world beyond — the world from which the faces came and which seemed so vast and interesting.

"Don't do it!" said Finn. But Bob's mind was made up. Finn had tried to dissuade him with a variety of different arguments, but each one just made Finn sound more like Finn – or more like Bob had begun to see him, anyway – a boring and unadventurous spoilsport.

"And so, despite Finn's protestations, Bob hunkered himself down hard against the gravel before unleashing an almighty burst of energy which propelled him up through the water, past the top of the castle and through the food-covered surface of the tank with a splash. His orange form carried on wriggling as it continued airborne for a few moments – over the top of the tank side, and out into the brave new world he had so longed to experience.

As he hung in the air outside the tank, Bob's eyes quickly adjusted to the sights around him, no longer magnified by the water in which he had spent most of his life. He thought to himself as he descended, "What a breath-taking sight." And then he realised that his new environment really was taking his breath away. As he came to land on the hardwood floor, he looked up towards the tank, high above him on the dresser. Finn was there, pressed up against the glass. He could see him calling, "Bob!" But he couldn't hear him. And he couldn't swim. And everything was such hard work. And it all looked blurry. And ...

For nearly 2000 years, our nation, culture and ways of life have been influenced by Christian values and thinking and we have flourished. But now, like the serpent in Eden, a growing whisper is likening Christianity to a prison, encouraging us to break free from it in search of a brave new world. Call me a spoilsport if you like, but I'm not convinced.

Leonard SAMPFORD

Private 35879, Machine Gun Corps formerly 25343
Bedfordshire Regiment. Died on 25 September 1916 aged 20.
Commemorated on the Thiepval Memorial, Pier and Face 5 C and 12 C, France and on the Wareside Cross.
He was the son of Frederick and Jane Sampford of Railway Tavern, Wareside and worked as a painter and decorator.

George Rolfe STUBBING, Private RR/1767, Rhodesian Rifles and South African Infantry 1st Regt. (Inf). Died on 10 April 1918 aged 29. He is commemorated on the Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial, Panel 15 - 16 and 16A and on the Wareside Cross. Son of Thomas and Jessie Stubbing and brother of Ethel Rolfe Stubbing, of New House, Wareside. He worked as a City Clerk and Stockbroker. Living in Wareside in 1911. Moved to Bulawayo, S Rhodesia thereafter.

Private 201403, Bedfordshire Regt. 1st/5th Bn. Died 16 March 1917 aged 29. He is buried in Kantara War Memorial Cemetery, Egypt (D.34.) and is commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Son of Thomas Tharby, of 2 Elm Cottages, Wareside. Husband of Caroline Janet Tharby, of Bayford, Hertford and worked as a farm labourer.

Ernest WARBY Private Hertfordshire Regiment

Sergeant 229 London Regiment (London Rifle Brigade) A Coy. Died 2 December 1916 aged 26. Buried in Holy Trinity Churchyard, Wareside and commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Son of William and Susan Alice Whybrew of The Red Lion, Wareside. He worked as a clerk in the Civil Service.

Peter Charles BAYFORD

Private 59891 Northamptonshire Regiment. Died on 3 November 1918 aged 28. Buried in Holy Trinity Churchyard, Wareside and commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Lived in the Dog House, Wareside. A railway signalman and porter before he signed up. Husband of Ethel V. Bayford later of 15, Croft Rd, Ware.

Phillip BOSWELL

Corporal 4/7164 Bedfordshire Regiment 4th Bn. transferred to (449586) 822nd Area Employment Coy. Labour Corps. Died on 13 December 1918 aged 43. Buried in Tournai Communal Cemetery Allied Extension (IV. B. 12.) and commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Son of John and Mercy Boswell of Babbs Green, Wareside; husband of Elizabeth Emily Gale (formerly Boswell), of 28, Apton Fields, Bishops Stortford, Herts. He worked as a farm labourer.

Andrew Richard BUXTON

Lieutenant Rifle Brigade. Died on 7 June 1917 aged 37. Buried in Oosttaverne Wood Cemetery, Belgium (I. A. 7.) and commemorated on the Wareside Cross.

Son of Mr. and Mrs. J. H. Buxton, of Easneye, Ware, Herts. Member of the Barclays banking family. Director in Westminster branch from 1909 until he joined up. Keen on field sports. Enlisted 24 Sep 1914. Entered France in July 1915. Spent two years on and off in the trenches around Ypres, Hooge, Messines etc. Killed in action on the first day of the Battle of Messines Ridge.

Charles Howard DIXON (Mentioned in Dispatches)





Private 203507 Hertfordshire Regiment. Died on 15 November 1917 aged 19. Commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Son of George and Sarah Ann Ede, of Helham Green, Wareside.

George William Ambrose KINGHAM

Lieutenant The Buffs (East Kent Regiment) 1st Bn. attd. West African Frontier Force. Died 9 November 1917 aged 22. Buried in Paddington Old Cemetery, Kilburn, London (1 D. 10387) and commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Born in London only son of George Frederick and Lila Emily Kingham, of 2, Brick Court, Temple, London, and Mardock Lodge, Wareside, Herts. Educated at the City of London School. Member of the Middle Temple; Freeman of the City of London.

Gazetted 2nd Lieut on 5 September 1914. Sandhurst 9 Nov 1915 to July 1916. Entered France on September 1916. Wounded, shell-shock 29 Nov 1916. After surgery returned to front on April 1917. Applied to West African Frontier Force in October 1917 but was drowned when SS Umgeni was sunk off

Applied to West African Frontier Force in October 1917 but was drowned when 33 Onigeni was sunk. Scotland with all on board on the way there.

George SALMONS

Private 203494 Bedfordshire Regiment. Died 16 August 1917 aged 19. Commemorated on the Wareside Cross, Son of Mr John Salmons of 135 Musley Hill, Ware.

John HUDSON

Rifleman 392437 London Regiment (Queen Victoria's Rifles) 1st/9th Bn. Died 14 April 1917 aged 34. He is commemorated on the Arras Memorial (Bay 10) and on the Wareside Cross. Son of William and Helen Hudson, of Arundel, Sussex. Husband of Margaret Hudson, of The Gardens, Blakesware, Wareside.

Alban GOODALL

Private G96322 Royal Fusiliers 3rd Bn. and Shropshire Light Infantry (16730). Died on the 4 November 1918 aged 35. Buried in Fontaine-au-Bois Communal Cemetery (B. 17.) and commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Son of Arthur and Evelyn Goodall, of Mottram, Macclesfield. Lived in Pontrilas, Herefordshire. Entered France on 18 May 1915 and was killed in action.

Wilfred GOODALL

Private 13110 Essex Regiment. Died 31 August 1919 aged 25. Buried in Cologne Southern Cemetery (XI. G. 3.) and commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Born in Henley-on-Thames. Lived in 2 Blakesware Cottages, Wareside. Gamekeeper. Died of wounds.

Herbert HEAD

Petty Officer 234282 Royal Navy HMS Queen Mary. Died on 31 May 1916 aged 25. Commemorated on the Portsmouth Naval Memorial (Panel 11).Son of George and Emily Head, of Waters Place. Ware. Killed in action against the German fleet in the North Sea (Battle of Jutland). HMS Queen Mary was hit by combined fire from German battlecruisers SMS Derfflinger and SMS Seydlitz and sunk with the loss off all but 9 of her 1,275 crew.

William Frank Gardiner BAIRD

Captain Bedfordshire Regiment 4th Bn. Attached Lincolnshire Regiment. Died on 5 November 1914 aged 29. Buried in Boulogne Eastern Cemetery (II. B. 5.) and commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Son of Sir William Baird, Bart. and the Hon. Lady Baird, of Saughton Hall, Midlothian; husband of Violet Mary (Croft) Baird, of Fanhams Hall, Ware. Formerly served in the 7th Dragoon Guards.

Arthur James SALMON

L/Cpl 56803 Lancashire Fusiliers 18th Bn. Died on 31 October 1918 aged about 38. Buried in Vichte Military Cemetery (III. A. 8.).Born in Wareside to William and Mary Salmon of Morley Ponds Cottage, Wareside. Married Rose Wheeler from Little Hormead, Herts. and had 4 children. Worked as a Steam Wagon Driver in Allen and Hanbury's Pharmaceuticals in Ware. Lived at 73 High Oak Road, Ware.

Ernest MARTIN

Private 266608 Bedfordshire Regiment 4th Bn. formerly 4964 Hertfordshire Regiment. Died on 27 August 1918 aged 30. Buried in A.I.F. Burial Ground, Flers, France and commemorated on the Wareside Cross. Husband of Kate Alice Martin, of 14, Lincoln St., Brighton.

He was injured in action on 31 July 1917 at St Julien with the Hertfordshires and then killed in action on 27 August 1918 with the Bedfordshire Regiment.

Wareside Allotment Association

Marion and Ghas Sheriadah kindly hosted the Wareside Allotment Association Annual General Meeting in July.

Plot holders were saddened to hear of the death of Becky Hancox who had been active in the Association. It was agreed to commemorate her by converting her allotment plot into a communal area with fruit trees and a bench.

A number of changes were proposed to the allotment area:

The area will be extended to that originally agreed with the parish council. The additional area will be fenced initially and hedging will be added at a later date. Three more water containers will be purchased. When roofed over and guttering in place this will bring the water capture and storage capacity available to over six thousand litres. This will go a long way to ease any irrigation issues.

The Association Treasurer (Stella Beavis) reported that the accounts are looking healthy with several hundred pounds in the bank and the additional fencing and storage containers are within budget. Most of the existing plots are occupied and all fees for 2017 / 18 have been received. Next fees are due in September. Despite the exceedingly hot weather resulting in poor harvest of many root vegetables due to the ground cracking, crops of soft fruit have been better. There have been good returns from strawberry plants and large volumes of blackcurrants - over eight pounds from one lot!.






